

2019 Measles Outbreaks* from the CDC with Excerpts from the Indicated Health Departments & Links to the Same for More Information, as of 4/2019 (see each excerpt for exact date):

*An outbreak is defined as 3 or more cases in a geographic region.

CALIFORNIA:

“In 2019, two outbreaks linked to patients with international travel have been reported in California. As of April 17, 2019, 23 confirmed measles cases, including 13 outbreak-associated cases, have been reported.

CDPH will update case counts weekly on Thursdays if new cases are reported.

MICHIGAN:

“As of April 17, 2019, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services has confirmed 43 total measles cases statewide since March 13, 2019.

The outbreak, which began in mid-March, has resulted in 40 cases in Oakland County, one in Wayne County and one in the City of Detroit. In addition, an international traveler was diagnosed with measles following a visit to Washtenaw County, during which time he was contagious. Infected individuals range in age from 8 months to 63 years; a majority of the cases involve adults.”

NEW JERSEY:

“2019 Measles Outbreak, Ocean County

As of April 23, a total of 14 confirmed measles cases have been reported in NJ for 2019. The New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) is working with local health officials to investigate an outbreak of measles associated with Ocean County, declared on March 15. There are currently 12 outbreak-associated cases including 8 in Ocean County residents and 4 in one Monmouth County household. This household has a direct epidemiologic link to the outbreak community in Ocean County.

February 2019: New Jersey Department of Health Warns Residents of 4 Confirmed Measles Cases

The New Jersey Department of Health is warning residents about 4 confirmed cases of measles. In unrelated incidents:

- A Bergen County resident developed measles after contact with a community outside New Jersey experiencing an ongoing outbreak of measles and potentially exposed individuals in Bergen County;
- An Essex County resident developed measles following travel from a country that is currently experiencing an ongoing outbreak of measles; and
- 2 Ocean County residents were confirmed to have measles and potentially exposed individuals in Ocean County between February 26 and March 5.

The Department and local health officials are investigating whether there is any connection between the recent Ocean County cases, the previous outbreak in Ocean County, or current outbreaks in other states.

April 2019: Potential Measles Exposures in Monmouth County Related to Highly Suspect Case

The New Jersey Department of Health is warning residents of a highly suspect case of measles — a very contagious disease — in a Middlesex County resident who may have exposed individuals in Monmouth County on April 17 and 19. The Department and local health officials are investigating any connection to the current Ocean County measles outbreak or outbreaks in other states.”

NEW YORK CITY

“Recent Outbreak in Brooklyn and Queens:

As of April 18, 2019, there have been 359 confirmed cases of measles in Brooklyn and Queens since October. Most of these cases have involved members of the Orthodox Jewish community. The initial child with measles was unvaccinated and acquired measles on a visit to Israel, where a large outbreak of the disease is occurring. Since then, there have been additional people from Brooklyn and Queens who were unvaccinated and acquired measles while in Israel. **People who did not travel were also infected in Brooklyn or Rockland County.”**
