



- As more cases of COVID-19 have been seen around the globe, children have not escaped infection, critical illnesses and a some deaths
- ✓ In particular, those < 1 year may have critical illness although all ages, including teens have been identified
- ✓ There are less known COVID-19 infections in pediatrics, around 2% of total cases throughout the world



- GI symptoms, with diarrhea, vomiting, abdominal pain, nausea & anorexia
- Nasal congestion
- Less respiratory symptoms; dry cough & SOB seen; sometimes thick secretions,
- ✓ Sore throat
- ✓ Fatique
- ✓ Headache
- Myalgias & Arthralgias
- Other co-infections with COVID also found

New Syndromes in Kids



- Recent reports from Europe, Asia and now in the US of 2 different syndromes
 - Kawasaki-like syndrome
 - Toxic Shock
- Called Pediatric Multi-System Inflammatory Syndrome
- ✓ Both critical and milder cases All Must Be Found for treatment
- Syndrome may be ID'd first & then COVID tested
- Need quick supportive care & specialist care
- Deaths have occurred

Condition may change rapidly:

- A child with persistent fever and/or ill
- ✓ Rash
- Swollen or peeling hands/feet
- Bloodshot eyes
- ✓ Irritation/swelling of the mouth, tongue, lips or throat
- Evidence of single or multi organ failure (i.e. shock, cardiac or respiratory failure, renal, GI or neuro disorder


Todd Stout

COVID-19 Monitoring






Trigger Count per Agency: 💗



Graphs represent in queue, active or completed calls between the hours of 4/30/2020 and 5/13/2020 11:59:59 PM







Graphs represent in queue, active or completed calls between the hours of 4/30/2020 and 5/13/2020 11:59:59 PM






Bigger Picture

Graphs represent in queue, active or completed calls between the hours of 3/1/2020 and 5/13/2020 11:59:59 PM








